Natural Man Illumined: Johann Gichtel's Mystical Figures at Ephrata

Nicholas Siegert, Guide Supervisor at the Ephrata Cloister, will offer his research into the 1696 symbolism of German theosophist, Johann Gichtel. Gichtel's esoteric illustration, "Awakened Man" appears circa sixty-four years later as "Mystical Man" in the illustrations of Ephrata member, Jacob Martin. Founded in 1732, Ephrata became a benchmark of early American utopian experiments and the largest communal society in Colonial America.
